Phishing Emails

As some of you might be aware, we have a phishing email sent to several club members pretending to be the Club President. The email said that I was out of the state and needed help with a transaction. A response to the email would generate another email telling you to go purchase several gift cards with a specific dollar amount. This is a phishing email and a scam.

Scammers are using tactics like this to try and get money from you. Please keep an eye out for these kinds of emails. Most of the emails will be sent from a different email address, even though it might have the persons name listed. Some might spoof (look like) the person's email address to try and make you believe it is really from that person.

To start with, the board would never send a club member an email asking for them to handle a transaction for the club. That is why we have a Treasurer and a backup to the Treasurer. If the club did, for what ever reason, decided to have a club member help, that would be agreed upon by the board and the person involved would have been notified/involved with the board. It would not just come out of the blue like this one did.

If you think you have a phishing email from someone on the club's board, send them a separate email (do not use reply), contact them by phone, or contact one of the other board members to verify before doing anything. Again, the board and anyone on it will not randomly ask you to handle a transaction for the club. The best action is to not respond to the email and Report the email as Spam. And on that note, this tactic could be use outside of the club. So make sure to check with the person if the email doesn't look right.

"I started out by sending single tones to Mitsuo, which he copied well, and then sent several sequences of calls and grid. Mitsuo was able to decode calls and my grid at 1146 UTC and 1234 UTC. Signal levels were –23 dB and –25 dB." Ward noted that the first EME (Earth-Moon-Earth) contact on 47 GHz took place in early 2005.

"More 47 GHz tests are being run in the next few days with Manfred, DL7YC," Ward said. "We hope for similar success."

96-year-old ham radio operator makes an out-of-this world connection

TORONTO — For decades, Jean Moffett, VE3WAD has been reaching out over the airwaves. An amateur—or ham—radio operator, Moffett has connected with people around the globe. "You can always talk to other people, in other parts of the world," Moffett said, speaking to CTV News Toronto.

"You can send your signals to satellites. I've talked to people from the Arctic to the Antarctic." And on Wednesday at the Ontario Science Centre, the 96-year-old got to go even further.

A ham radio connection, relayed through northern Italy, allowed the senior and a group of students to speak with Commander Luca Parmitano aboard the International Space Station (ISS).
