Meeting Minutes 06/17/2021

Meeting was held over-the-air on the 146.660 MHz repeater and called to order at 7:00 PM.

Pledge of Allegiance

Officers present – President Kyle W8KDB, Vice President Tom KE8GDN, W8IDR Ivan, Member-at-Large Smokey N5MKY, Secretary Stephanie W8AEZ

Others in attendance: W8RVT Don, N8ARR Jay, W8JRD John, WD8DCA Leo, KE8MOI Paul, KD8MA Jim, KD8VJL Wayne, KD8VJN Sue, N8LS Jack, N1CEW Craig, W8JMZ Jim.

Secretary's Report: The Secretary's Report was published in the Feedback a little later than usual due to an error in the May 20th SMARS club membership meeting that required correction. The report was accepted with no further discussion or objection.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Ivan W8IDR reported that \$30.00 in dues was received along with a \$21.00 donation this past month. Expenses included \$46.24 for the AT&T bill. The club account total is currently \$1,648.79.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- Hamfest - With the lifting of restrictions on gathering, some hamfests are starting up. St. Joseph Amateur Radio Club is hosting a hamfest in Centerville on July 25th and the Northern Indiana Repeater Association has one scheduled for Elkhart, Indiana. The board has agreed to have a small hamfest provided that someone steps forward to plan one. Caveats: SMARS must have permission to use the location and any applicable CDC guidelines must be followed. Persons interested in planning and hosting a small hamfest are asked to contact Kyle at w8kdb@arrl.net.
- SKYWARN - Smokey N5MKY reported that there was an in-person meeting this past Tuesday, June 15th. A presentation on Traffic Handling, Radiograms and ICS was given by Smokey. Bret White would like Skywarn to participate in more ICS and emergency traffic training and there are plans for some ICS or Emergency traffic to be incorporated in the next net. Training also for auxiliary communication is planned. One failure of a siren at the June emergency siren test. W8JMZ mentioned that our area has been upgraded to moderate risk for severe weather this evening.
- Field Day - Will be next Saturday and Sunday at Ft. Custer Recreation Area. All three trailers will be hauled to the site at 3:00pm next Friday. No food is provided for Friday. W8AEZ will pick up Saturday's catered meal from Dig In Cafe around 3:00pm. N5MKY advised he sent an email to Tom WR8G regarding setting up and networking computers. Smokey will also compose a radiogram for Field Day. N8ARR advised that he does not have the SMARS banner and Field Day signs. He suggested checking in the VHF trailer.

KE8GDN and his wife visited the Field day site a few days ago. The site has been mowed, however, there are still large boulders blocking the driveway to the site. He will check the trailers for the signs. W8RVT will be coming out to assist him with working on the antenna. The large canopy and some equipment has been swapped between the trailers and will still need to be sorted and placed back into the correct trailers. N8ARR advised that a couple of years ago there were 3-ring binders in each of the trailers listing the specific equipment that should be in each trailer. W8KDB stated he could drop by next week to assist with checking the equipment in the trailers. W8RVT reported that the International Space Station will be operating in crossband repeater mode during Field Day weekend. Bonus points are available, including for posting on social media, visitation by an elected official, and traffic handling, and one repeater contact with the ISS. KE8MOI has offered to help W8RVT with satellite tracking. Per Kyle, WR8G has the server ready to go. The computers are in the trailers and can be updated after they are connected to the server. He passed along a reminder to all participants to get a State Park Pass sticker or purchase one at the site in order to enter the park. W8IDR will bring a check for \$150.00 to cover the club's donation to Ft. Custer for our use of the area. Jim W8JMZ confirmed that the Skywarn group will be holding their Field Day at the American Legion off B Drive.

- VE session – The next SMARS VE session will be on June 124th at Maple United Methodist Church in the downstairs Fellowship Hall, beginning at 7:00 pm. One candidate has contacted W8KDB thus far. W8RVT asked if the club will be retaining some of the VE fees to cover costs for hosting the sessions. He suggested that the examiners can request for mileage reimbursement and perhaps donate their mileage reimbursement to the club. Kyle confirmed that he had contacted the VEC reimbursement will be up to \$35.00 for renting the testing room and that SMARS will submit a request for reimbursement to the VEC. If SMARS were to retain the amount, the club would need to retain records for up to 2 years.
- Repeaters - Don W8RVT reported everything has been working well this past month.

OLD BUSINESS

- KE8GDN discussed the May 29th Foxhunt at Leila Arboretum. Coffee and donuts were provided for the participants, the weather was good, and everyone seemed to have a good time.
- W8KDB reminded that \$15.00 membership dues can be mailed in to SMARS via the PO Box.
- An in-person meeting in October is planned at Maple United Methodist Church for officer elections. Persons interested in running for office should email Kyle at W8KDB.

NEW BUSINESS

- Several members would like to resume face-to-face meetings prior to October. KE8GDN proposed renting one of the blue pavilions near Bailey Park for hosting an outdoor club meeting. There is a \$35.00 rental fee for the pavilion.
- KE8GDN is working with Dave W8RDX to organize another couple of Foxhunts at Ft. Custer during Field Day weekend. Anyone who would like to participate in Foxhunting but who does not have a directional antenna can contact KE8GDN at tomcworth@aol.com for antenna-build plans.

A motion to adjourn was made by W8IDR, seconded by N8ARR. The meeting was adjourned at 7:59 PM.

Board Meeting Minutes 07/06/2021

The board meeting was held outdoors at Bailey Park. Meeting was called to order at 5:33 pm.

Officers present: Kyle W8KDB, Ivan W8IDR, Tom W. KE8GDN, Stephanie W8AEZ, Smokey N5MKY

Topics

- Field Day: Leaks in the trailers (especially VHF trailer #3 and the UHF trailer) were discovered during Saturday's heavy rains. All of the trailers will need re-caulking. A recommendation was made to install magnetic bug-screens in all of the trailers. W8AEZ reported she has two that she will donate. The radio was removed from trailer #2 and placed in trailer #1 as the Kenwood stopped working. A power supply is also missing from trailer #1. A thorough inventory needs to be taken of the equipment in all three trailers. Anything that the club is not using should be sold or donated. Some of the plastic totes storing equipment have cracks and will need replacing.
- Club Meetings: Maple United Methodist Church has said SMARS can resume holding Thursday meetings due to lifting of COVID restrictions. The per-use cost for rental of the fellowship hall is \$35.00. N5MKY and KE8GDN suggested holding club membership meetings outside at Bailey Park. **Pros:** Meeting outside at the picnic tables would cost the club nothing. The outdoor setting might be less stuffy than the fellowship hall of the church. **Cons:** Outdoor meetings would be subject to the weather. If the club wished to reserve the covered pavilion, there is a fee of would have to pay \$35.00. If SMARS did reserve the pavilion and found it occupied by another party, SMARS would be responsible for telling the other party to move to another location. The board decided to host the July 15th club membership meeting at

Bailey Park (weather permitting). If the weather is poor on the day of the meeting, club members will be notified that the meeting will be held over-the-air on the 146.660 MHz repeater.

- Christmas Party: Due to COVID restrictions last December, the SMARS Christmas Party was cancelled. The board agreed to move forward with plans for holding a club Christmas Party this December. Stephanie W8AEZ will contact Coney Island Cafe to see if SMARS can reserve their banquet room for the event.
- Lifetime Club Membership: A club member suggested that SMARS offer lifetime memberships. Possibilities discussed include \$125 for a 10-year membership, \$250 for a 20-year membership, or \$300 for a life membership.
- Foxhunts: Tom KE8GDN is planning another foxhunt, either at Fort Custer Recreation Area or Leila Arboretum, toward the end of July. He asked that anyone interested in participating contact him at tomcworth@aol.com.
- Treasurer's report: Ivan W8IDR reported an expenditure of \$116.20 to Dig In Cafe for providing Saturday afternoon's meal at Field Day.
