# ARRL support for clubs could use some improvement

Often, when you hear ARRL officials speak, they extol the virtues of amateur radio clubs, saying things like, "Clubs are the lifeblood of amateur radio." For example, Dale Williams, WA8EFK, in response to my e-mail congratulating him on his appointment as the new ARRL Great Lakes Division director, said that his "plans are to push to keep things local, club-related, and bottom-up driven."

Of course, that kind of set me off. When it comes to club support, the ARRL is more talk than action.

One example of this lack of support is that there hasn't been an issue of the ARRL Club News newsletter for years. Even so, if you log into the ARRL website and look at your e-mail subscriptions page, you'll see that it says that it's supposed to be a monthly newsletter.

I'll also note that the ARRL CEO Harold Kramer, WJ1B,left this particular newsletter off the list of available newsletters in his June QST column. I don't know who at HQ is responsible for producing this newsletter, but the fact that there hasn't been one for so long speaks volumes to me.

Another example is the club commission program. Under this program, clubs get a \$15 commission when they sign up a new member. That's not bad, but the commission falls to only \$2 for renewing members. According to a former treasurer of ARROW, my club here in Ann Arbor, MI, \$2 just wasn't enough to make it worth his while to process renewals.

To be fair, it's not all bad news. The ARRL website does have a page with information on how to set up and run an active club (<u>http://www.arrl.org/affiliatedclub-resources</u>). The ARRL also has a club liability insurance program is a decent deal for clubs, but that program probably doesn't require much effort on the ARRL's part. The ARRL is also supposed to refer new hams to clubs, but I'm not sure exactly how they do that, and I don't think ARROW's gained any new members from this recently.

Let me ask you. Is your club getting the support it needs from the ARRL? If so, I'd like to hear about what you think they're doing right. If not, I'd like to know what you think they should be doing to help your club.

Hamfest 2015 - Tom WR8G confirmed the contract for Wings Stadium Annex was signed and down payment submitted. Additional discussion is needed regarding the talk-in frequency. The flier is now ready for final review.

SKYWARN - Dave W8RDX reported that there were a couple of successful formal nets this month. Reminder that there will be a Ham-in-a-Day session on Saturday, July 19th at Miller College with VE session beginning at 3:00 p.m.

VE Session - John W8JRD advised there was 1 candidate for the June VE session and that candidate earned his ticket. The new question pool for Technician class took effect on July 1st. There are upcoming changes in VE procedures which will be shared accordingly. The FCC has requested vanity call sign fees be increasing from \$16.10 to \$21.60 for the 10-year license term. Judy KD8SHK will pass along the number potential candidates for the upcoming Ham-in-a-Day on July 18th.

Field Day 2014 - Don W8RVT has electronically submitted the Field Day report. The club accrued approximately 4000 points in this year's competition, which was an increase over last year's event. Participants felt that the new logging software installed by Terry N8LN worked well. Doc K8OLY thanked all who helped out at Field Day, and a special thank-you was extended to Bev KA8CXS for her assistance with the food. Two visitors to the event thanked the club for the warm welcome they received at the event and felt everyone was helpful and friendly.

SMARS Board - Per Gary N8QC, the board has decided to sell the 5 kW Generac generator, asking price \$300.00.

Proceeds from the sale will go toward the purchase of a Honda generator.

Old Business - Terry N8LN reported the D-Star antenna was installed on July 7th at 190' on the tower located on D Drive and 9 Mile Road (old Emmett Township Fire Station #2).
