This morning, I got an e-mail from a reader who asked, "I would like you to help me understand software-defined radio (SDR) and applications for hams."

Now, I'm in no way, shape, or form an expert on SDR. I know what SDR is—or at least I think I do—but how to explain it to a newcomer? So, the first thing I did, of course, was to do a Google search. Searching for "software defined radio for amateur radio operators" yielded 181,000 results.

The first few slides give a good overview of what we mean when we say a radio is "software-defined." Then, the presentation digs into some of the technical aspects of SDR.

The ARRL website has a page on SDR, but unfortunately, most of the links are to articles published from 1998 to 2002. this page should really be updated. It

does include a few good links, though, including one to the <u>BORES</u>
<u>Signal Processing DSP course – Introduction to DSP.</u>

Other good resources that I found include:

- An Introduction to HF Software-Defined Radio, by Andrew Barron, ZL3DW. This is a book on the topic in PDF form. Actually, I'm not really sure if this is a legal copy, as a <u>print</u> version is available on Amazon for \$20
- New to SDR?
- RTL-SDR.COM. This site is all about using DVB-T TV tuner dongles based on the RTL2832U chipset as software-defined radios. These dongles are very inexpensive and a cheap way to get into SDR.

If a beginner asked you this question, how would you respond? What are some resources that you have found useful?

#### 12/07/2016

As in past years, Santa Claus will be spreading the spirit of Christmas via Amateur Radio, but this year the elves are taking over the show. Twelve elves are operating OF9X ("Old-Father-Nine-Christmas") for the entire month of December, each with a 3-letter identification. Radio amateurs can work OF9X on all bands and modes, from 630 meters (where authorized) to 70 centimeters. Each contact is worth 1 point for stations in Europe and 2 points for stations outside Europe. The elves provide the multiplier — up to 12 — to determine your final score. Only contacts made in 2016 are valid. Logs are available on ClubLog, and the log will indicate which elf was worked, in case you miss the ID.

The elves on the air and their 3-letter IDs are: Arto, OH2KW (ART); Arttu, OH2FB (ATU); Jyri, OH2KM (JYR); Martti, OH2BH (MAR); Niko, OH2GEK (NIK); Pauli, OH5BQ (PAU); Pekka, OH2TA (PEK); Pertti, OH2BEE (PER); Raimo, OH2BCI (RAI); Tom, OH6VDA (TOM); Pertti, OH2PM (SIM), and Erik, OH2LAK (LAK).

Three awards are available: SKC Award (Santa is King of Christmas)
— at least 50 points; WMC Award (Warm and Memorable Christmas)
— at least 35 points, and RNS Award (Remember those Red Nose Elves) — at least 20 points.

**E-mail** your log and your point calculation by January 5, 2017. Full-color award certificates will be sent via return mail. Include the name to be printed on the award and your e-mail address.

High-scoring operators and their children on each continent will be offered an opportunity to speak with Santa during Christmas week. Details will be available on the OF9X QRZ.com profile page.

This year's OF9X activity will commemorate ARRL President Emeritus Jim Haynie, W5JBP (SK), who conceived of "The Big Project" to get Amateur Radio into classrooms. The project became the present-day ARRL Education & Technology Program. The OF9X Santa Activity patron is Finland's Prime Minister Juha Sipilä, who has said that "using the latest technology to promote Santa is valuable support for Finland and helps make this Christmas a special one." The OF9X activity is supported by the Finnish Telecommunications Regulatory Authority and the Finnish Amateur Radio Association (SRAL), and is organized by Radio Club of Pusula, OH9W, with Radio Arcala, OH8X, of Oulu in the frozen North.
